What is the Present Simple?

The present simple is a verb tense used to describe habits & routines



I wake up at 7 a.m. every day, but I do not wake up early on the weekend.



I get up quickly, but I don't get up early when I'm tired



I brush my teeth after breakfast, but I don't brush them before eating.

I do. I brush.

I do not do. I do not brush.



I get dressed for work, but I don't wear formal clothes at home.



don't use any hair gel.



I make coffee every day, but I don't drink it at night.



I go to work by bus, but don't go by car.



I check my emails, but I don't answer all of them immediately.



1- THE PRESENT SIMPLE - AFFIRMATIVE FORM

The Affirmative Form: (Subject + Verb)

wake up at 7:00 a.m. every morning.

Subject-Verb Agreement:

Add (s) when the subject is in the Third-Person Singular.

Examples:

- She goes shopping every Thursday.
- She exercises every morning before work.

The Present Simple – Third-Person Singular Rules

Rule 1: Add -s (Most Verbs)

work → works

play → plays

read → reads

swim → swims

sell → sells

Rule 2: Add -es

(Verbs Ending in -

s, -sh, -ch, -x, -o)

pass → passes

wash → washes

teach → teaches

fix → fixes

go → goes

Rule 3: Change -y to

-ies (Consonant + y)

stud<mark>y</mark> → studies

tr<mark>y</mark> → tr<mark>i</mark>es

carry → carries

cry → cries

fly → flies

Rule 4: Add-s

(Vowel+y)

play → plays

stay → stays

enjoy → enjoys

buy→ buys

say → says

delay → delays

2- THE PRESENT SIMPLE - NEGATIVE FORM

The Negative Form: (Subject + doesn't/ don't + Verb)
I do not like swimming.

Subject-Verb Agreement:

- Add (does not/doesn't) when the subject is singular.
- Add (do not/don't) when the subject is plural.
- They exercise every morning before work.
- They don't exercise before work.
